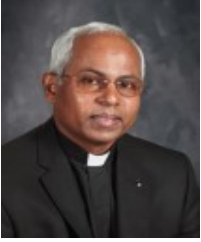


A Letter From Father Francis

Mission Appeal – Brothers of St. Charles Lwanga August 17th-18th

We will have a representative from the Brothers of St. Charles Lwanga, also known as the Bannakaroli Brothers, and their project Watoto wa Lwanga in Kenya. Within this project the focus is on the “Under Five Years Feeding Program” also known as the “Teen Mothers Program”.

About 20 years ago, the brothers noticed several children dying in their area because food was scarce, and they resolved to do something to help. They provide food for the young child and their mother, they teach the mother marketable skills, hygiene, nutrition and parenting skills, and they provide social worker support when it is needed.
