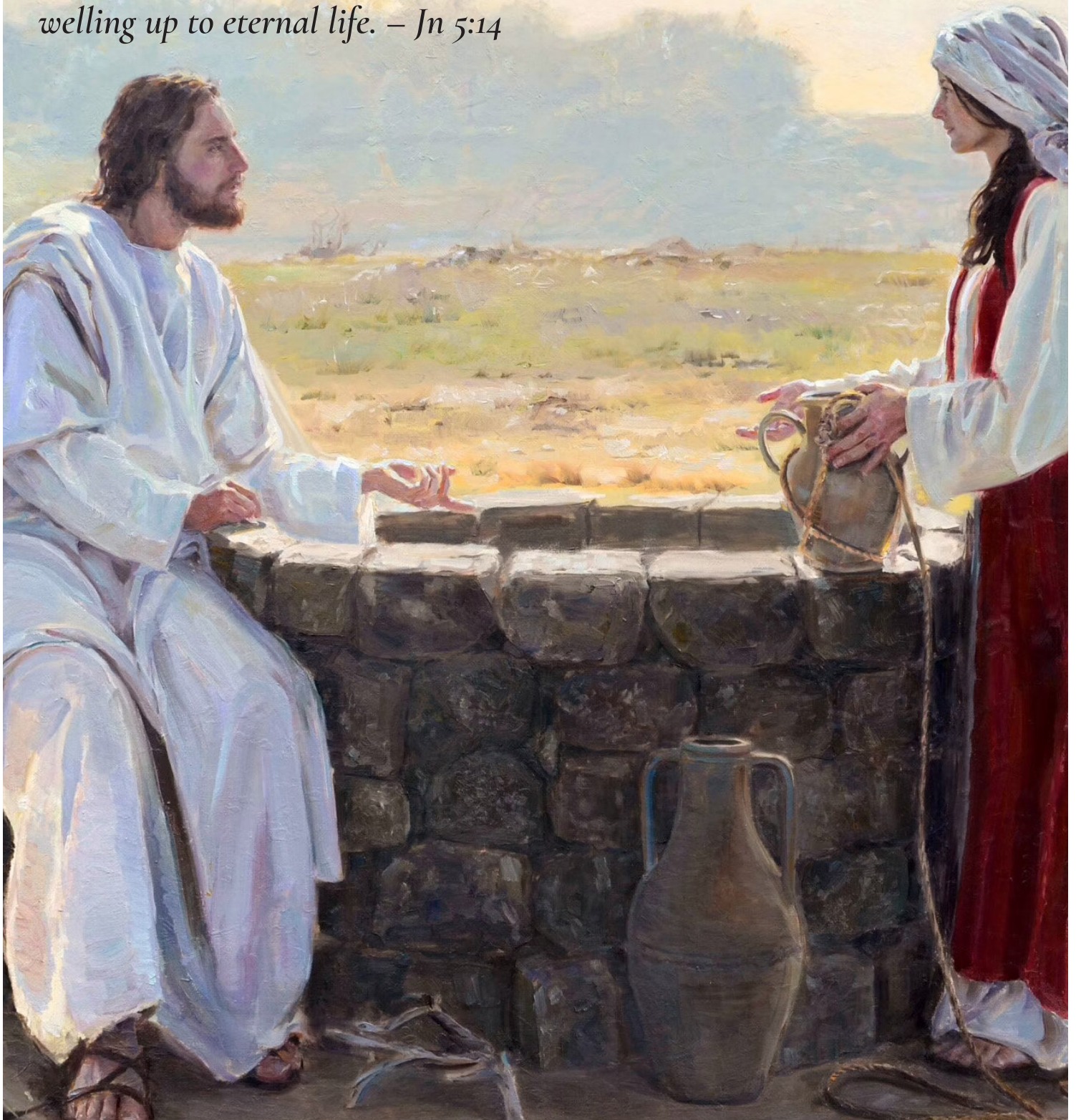

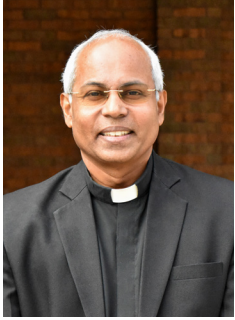

# A Message from Father Francis



## Jesus offers living water, the gift of the Holy Spirit

My Dear Friends in Christ,

The thirsting soul: our need to drink regularly is obvious; without water we would quickly die. Not so easily recognized is the soul's thirst for meaning, for vision and purpose in life. We can be fully preoccupied with the surface of things, and quite neglect our spirit's obscure longing for eternal life. Like the Israelites, we worry constantly about physical needs, but are often unmindful of God who supplies them. Today, Jesus offers us the refreshing water of eternal life, a power of faith and union-with-God which is our deepest need, and can satisfy the thirst of our soul. How the desert blossoms, when water is brought to it. The same miracle of growth can take place in the parched soul, if God lets his Spirit flow over me. All the ravages of doubt, fear and sin will yield to the new life of grace.

A sacramental washing: Already in baptism, the sacramental washing with water by the Church was a first contact with the grace of Christ. I was given a good start, planted well in the garden of God, with room to put down roots, and draw vital nourishment from the living spring of the Savior. Yet, I need continuing help, to keep my spirit alive and pleasing to God as life goes on. Like the desert-wandering Jews, I suffer from thirst; I grow weary in confronting problems and temptations. Jesus guarantees me the "living water" I need. His own Spirit is always at hand, as a force of encouragement and fidelity.

"To dwell in the house of the Lord": Our deep desire remains, something not confined to Christians but shared by the mystic tradition in other religions: namely, the yearning to come into the presence of God, and be welcomed by God. All of us are called by him to drink of that "fountain of water, springing up to everlasting life." In times of widespread religious skepticism, the hope of heaven as eternal life after death is often cast in doubt as wishful thinking. But we cling to this hope, relying on the word of Jesus. For Paul and the early Christians, the hope of eternal life breathed joy into all their efforts and sacrifices. Fidelity until death seemed well worthwhile, "for the weight of glory that will be revealed in us." ***Our part to play, is turning aside from sin***, and trying to live by the gospel. God can be absolutely relied on to fulfill his promise, and will in time satisfy the deep thirst of our spirit.

## P.S. Let Us Come Together As A Parish and School Community In All We Do

The gospel is always calling on us to change and grow. Jesus preached a message of conversion. Turn away from evil. Turn towards God. Conversion is the everyday experience of choosing or refusing to grow. Lent is the time when the Church stops and reflects on what changes the Gospel demands of us.

Lent calls us to renew our commitment to ourselves, to the people we encounter in our day-to-day lives and to our God. Lent is a time to take "ownership" of faith. It is a season for conversion by individuals and communities. The slogan reads: "Not to decide is to decide." Each day each one of us makes innumerable decisions. We choose what time to get up, what clothes to wear, what TV programs to watch, what newspaper articles to read. Sometimes the choice requires little thought; it is an automatic part of living and part of our routine of day-to-day life. Other choices call for considerable reflection, discussion, debate. Shall I marry him or her now? Should I change my job? What will be the effects in our lives if we move to a different city? These kinds of choices affect the basic fabric of our lives. They require significant changes in the way we live. Making such decisions involves looking at our values, and determining which among them takes priority at this time. Values are the realities that ultimately determine what we choose to do.

Living as a Christian is a response to a deliberate choice. It calls for a decision to place our faith in Christ. It is a gift offered to us, but accepting the gift is a personal decision. Lent is a special time when Christians renew their faith choice. It is the season when we reflect on the meaning and consequences of our baptism. We consider what baptismal commitment calls for in the decisions of daily life. This season of grace calls us to honestly look at how well our faith affects our decision in life.

May this time of renewal and conversion be a time of encountering the power of God's Spirit drawing us to a deeper and more abundant relationship with God. May this Lenten Season be a special time for all of us as we prepare to celebrate Easter with renewed faith and enthusiasm and commitment. May this be a time when we respond to the grace of God calling us once again to turn away from sin and be ever more faithful to God's call in our lives.

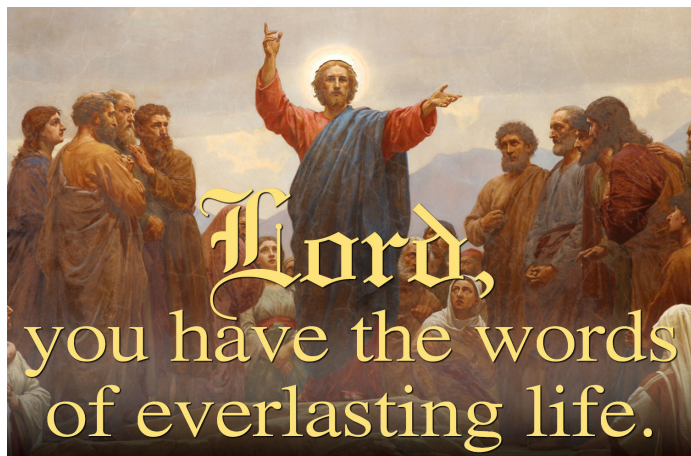

### **3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent**

#### **Gospel: John 4.5-42 – Jesus and the Samaritan Woman**

##### **Living in the Living Waters**

In the Gospel today we reflect on the episode of Jesus' meeting with the Samaritan woman at the well. The passage recounts that Jesus was "tired" yet he still went out of His way to minister to the woman. Jesus tells her that "the water that I will give will become a spring of water gushing up to eternal life." Through this image of water Jesus is alluding to the gift of the Holy Spirit that the Lord wishes to lavish upon His children (CCC 728).

As stewards of Christ we are called to generously share our time and talents with our parish community. However, a mere sharing of our gifts without the guidance and strength of the Holy Spirit can easily lead us to becoming burnt out, discouraged or resentful. It is important to have all of our charitable acts infused with the Spirit. This way it is not our own merits but the Lord's grace bringing about conversion in our parishes.

How often do we invoke the Holy Spirit before we serve the Lord as stewards? It is in this invocation that we humbly recognize that it is the Lord, through us, accomplishing great deeds. Let us begin each day with the traditional prayer to the Holy Spirit. "Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love." Let us bring about a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit into the hearts of our parish community by constantly turning to Him to strengthen us.

We are committed to assisting students who desire a Catholic education at St. Pius X. This is a great chance if your children have not been able to attend SPX due to cost. Basically, if you qualify below your children can attend without any tuition/fee expense

### What is the Choice Scholarship Program?

Indiana’s Choice Scholarship Program, commonly referred to as the voucher program, (authorized under IC 20-51-1 and IC 20-51-4) provides scholarships to eligible Indiana students to offset tuition costs at participating schools. Participating schools and interested parents/guardians work together to enroll students. For those that qualify, the scholarship could cover some or all of your student’s tuition. Eligibility is income based, please review the income guidelines and scholarship awards below.

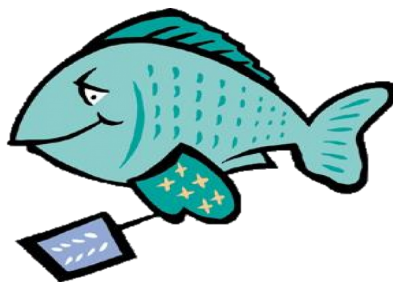

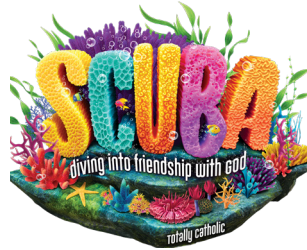
